Grades and grading

The grades will be based on the following elements:

- Online assignments with WebAssign. There will generally be two of these every week, due on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
- · Weekly quizzes held during the Thursday discussion sessions
- Four midterm exams (see <u>course webpage</u> for dates)
- A Final Exam

There will be no makeups for midterms exams or Thursday quizzes. Before computing the final grade, the lowest midterm and the two lowest Thursday quizzes will be dropped.

The weights used when computing the final grade are:

WebAssign Homework	10 %
Thursday Quizzes	15 %
Final exam	35 %
